PROJECT UPDATES

RESEARCH

- Survey implementation and data collection, capturing residents' perceptions on urban vulnerability, digitalisation and quality of life.
- Development of the Urban Vulnerability and Transformability Index, to support comparative analysis across cities and informing evidence-based decision-making.
- Living Lab activities, including coordination meetings with local administration and the co-design and testing of urban experiments together with citizens.
- Developing the structure for the CityFocus dashboard, which will visualise key indicators and insights in an accessible and interactive format.
- Collaborating on grant proposals to further support applied urban research and experimentation.
